MUSEUMS. Transfers the Political Museum and Hall of Fame from the Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism to the secretary of state. (See Act)

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 25:342(B)(3)(c) through (i), 352(A) and (B)(2)(b), 380.141(A), 380.142(A), (C), and (E), 380.143(B)(4) and (C)(2), 380.144, 380.145(A), (B), 3 (C)(2)(a) and (b)(iii), 380.146, and to enact R.S. 25:380.147, R.S. 36:744(DD) and 4 5 801.21, and to repeal R.S. 25:380.143(C)(3) and R.S. 36:209(W)(2) and (Y), relative to the Louisiana Political Museum and Hall of Fame; to transfer all powers, duties, 7 employees, and responsibilities from the jurisdiction of the office of state museums 8 in the Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism to the Department of State; 9 to provide relative to the governing authority of the museum, including its 10 composition, powers, duties, responsibilities, meetings, employees, and officers; to 11 provide for the adoption of rules, regulations and fees; to provide for receipt and use of funds, property, and self-generated revenue; to provide relative to the authority 12 13 of the museum with respect to the museum; to provide relative to personnel and 14 budgets of the museum; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related 15 matters.

The Louisiana Political Museum and Hall of Fame, referred to in this 10 Chapter as the "museum", is established as a facility in the town of Winnfield, parish of Winn, under the overall jurisdiction of the Department of Culture, Recreation and 11 Tourism State as more specifically provided in this Chapter. 12 13 §380.142. Advisory board; creation; domicile; appointment and compensation of 14 15 members A. The advisory board of the Louisiana Political Museum and Hall of Fame, 16 referred to in this Chapter as the "board", is hereby created in the Department of 17 Culture, Recreation and Tourism State. 18 19 C. The board shall be comprised of twenty members. Nineteen members 20 21 shall be appointed by the lieutenant governor secretary of state from the state of 22 Louisiana who have knowledge of and an interest in the preservation of political history and campaign artifacts of the state of Louisiana. The lieutenant governor 23 24 secretary of state, or his designee, shall be an ex officio member of the board. The Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism shall State may include in its annual budget request, required by R.S. 39:32, a request for funds 22 necessary for support of the Louisiana Political Museum and Hall of Fame. The 23 24 governor shall may include in the executive budget submitted to the legislature sufficient funding for the support of operations and maintenance of the museum and 25 its exhibits. 26 27 B. Funds appropriated by the legislature to the Department of State for 28 the operation of the Louisiana Political Museum and Hall of Fame shall be used 29 solely for that purpose and in accordance with the budget plan developed by the

Department of State. No administrative costs of any kind shall be charged by the Department of State for any services associated with placement of the museum within the jurisdiction of the department.

§380.145. Donations and loans; disposition of property

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A. The Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism State, the board, or any nonprofit corporation formed to support the museum and its activities, jointly or separately, may solicit and accept funds, governmental grants, donations, and contributions of lands, buildings, monies, artifacts, relics, audio and video recordings, motion picture films, works of art, or other property on behalf and as additions to the museum either in the form of loans or in the form of donations inter vivos or mortis causa, and the Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism State may acquire them by purchase, lease, or otherwise, subject to the terms, conditions, or limitations contained in the instrument by which such property is acquired. However, the museum, through the Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism State, or a nonprofit formed to support the programs and activities of the museum may enter into any and all contracts with any person, lender, or donor that it may deem fit, proper, and necessary to accept and receive such lands, buildings, monies, artifacts, relics, audio and video recordings, motion picture films, works of art, or other property on behalf of, as additions to, or for the benefit of the museum. The museum may serve as the beneficiary of any public or private trust or insurance policy heretofore or hereafter created for such purpose, pursuant to the provision of R.S. 9:2341 et seq.

B. The Board of Directors of the Louisiana State Museum secretary of state is granted the authority of deaccession with respect to any collection of the Louisiana Political Museum and Hall of Fame, and for such purpose is exempted from laws relative to the sale or disposal of surplus property. The Board of Directors of the Louisiana State Museum secretary of state shall establish policies and procedures necessary to carry out this authority in an orderly manner.

16	Any collection or other property of the Louisiana Political Museum and Hall
17	of Fame may, subject to approval of the Board of Directors of the Louisiana State
18	Museum secretary of state, be lent in part. The Board of Directors of the Louisiana
19	State Museum secretary of state shall ensure proper safeguards for its maintenance
20	and return and shall ensure that proper records are kept. The collection or other
21	property shall be available for use in educational projects, subject to the approval of
22	the Board of Directors of the Louisiana State Museum secretary of state.
23	§380.147. Museum administration; secretary of state; powers and duties
24	The secretary of state may:
25	(1) Establish, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act,
26	policies, rules, and regulations for the operation of the museum.

DIGEST

Long (SB 217)

<u>Present law</u> provides for the establishment of the La. Political Museum and Hall of Fame ("museum") in the town of Winnfield in Winn Parish and places it under the overall jurisdiction of the Dept. of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the office of state museums in the Dept. of Culture, Recreation and Tourism is responsible for the custody, administration, management, operation, maintenance, and preservation of the museum.

<u>Proposed law</u> transfers the overall jurisdiction of the museum from the office of state museums in the Dept. of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism to the secretary of state.

<u>Present law</u> creates the advisory board ("board") of the museum within the Dept. of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism. <u>Present law</u> further provides for membership and appointment of board members by the lieutenant governor and requires the board to advise the lieutenant governor on all matters relating to the operations of the museum. <u>Present law</u> further authorizes the board to enter into contracts with experts in certain fields in order to carry out

the purposes of the museum.

<u>Proposed law</u> transfers the provisions relative to the Dept. of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism to the Dept. of State, and transfers authority <u>from</u> the lieutenant governor <u>to</u> the secretary of state.

<u>Present law</u> provides that museums of local interest include the La. Political Museum and Hall of Fame, the La. Forestry Museum, and the Winn Parish Museum under the jurisdiction of the office of the state museum of the Dept. of Culture, Recreation.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes the La. Political Museum and Hall of Fame.

<u>Present law</u> requires the Dept. of Culture, Recreation and Tourism to include a request for funds necessary to support the museum in its annual budget request, and requires the governor to include in his executive budget submitted to the legislature sufficient funding to support the operations and maintenance of the museum and its exhibits.

<u>Proposed law</u> replaces the Dept. of Culture, Recreation and Tourism with the Dept. of State and authorizes, rather than requires, the Dept. of State to include in its annual budget a request for funds necessary to support the museum, and further authorizes, rather than requires, the governor to include in his executive budget sufficient funding for the support of operations and maintenance of the museum and its exhibits.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that funds appropriated by the legislature to the Dept. of State for operation of the La. Political Museum and Hall of Fame be used solely for the operation and maintenance of the museum and its exhibits, and requires that no administrative costs be charged by the Dept. of Sate for any services associated with placement of the museum within its jurisdiction.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the administration of the museum and authorizes the secretary of state to:

- (1) Establish policies, rules, and regulations for the operation of the museum in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.
- (2) Authorize reports and recommendations which include the issuance, publication, or distribution of general information documents or pamphlets which are published on a regular basis and are generally known as newsletters.
- (3) Employ, appoint, remove, and fix the term, compensation, and responsibilities of employees, including, but not limited to, a museum director and a curator.

<u>Proposed law</u> places the La. Political Museum and Hall of Fame and its advisory board within the Dept. of State and requires the board to exercise all advisory powers, duties, and functions provided for it. <u>Proposed law</u> further requires the board to administer and implement all programs authorized by law.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the secretary of state to be responsible for the performance and administration of the day-to-day operations of the museum, and those museum matters that are in the nature of accounting, payroll, budget control, procurement, data processing, and personnel management. <u>Proposed law</u> further requires the secretary of state to employ, appoint, fix the compensation of, remove, assign, and promote such personnel as is necessary for the efficient administration of the museum in accordance with civil service laws, rules, and regulations.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the board, in cooperation with any nonprofit corporation established to support the museum and hall of fame, to solicit and accept gifts and donations for the purposes of the museum, and authorizes any funds accepted on behalf of the museum to be

expended by the board, the nonprofit corporation, or the Dept. of State.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that no records, books, or papers stored in the museum or on museum premises are to be removed or transferred from the museum without the approval of the board.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that no action be taken under the provisions of <u>proposed law</u> until all debts or other obligations that are secured by or otherwise encumber any property to be transferred to the Dept. of State have been paid or otherwise removed from such property.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that if the transfer provided for in <u>proposed law</u> is not made within 4 years of July 1, 2011, then <u>proposed law</u> is null and void and of no effect.

Effective upon the effective date of a legislative appropriation of funds to finance the provisions of <u>proposed law</u>.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

<u>Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Senate and Governmental Affairs to the original bill.</u>

- 1. Deletes provision of <u>proposed law</u> that the board of the La. Political Museum and Hall of Fame is to exercise its powers, duties, and functions independently of the secretary of state.
- 2. Deletes provision of <u>proposed law</u> requiring the Dept. of State, the secretary of state, the Dept. of Culture, Recreation and Tourism, and the Friends of the La. Political Museum and Hall of Fame to take actions prior to July 1, 2011, necessary to implement proposed law on July 1, 2011.
- 3. Deletes provision that <u>proposed law</u> is effective upon signature of the governor.
