HOUSE BILL NO. 205

BY REPRESENTATIVE CROMER AND SENATOR CROWE

Prefiled pursuant to Article III, Section 2(A)(4)(b)(i) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

AN ACT

To amend and reenact Code of Civil Procedure Article 4847(A)(6), relative to certain limitations on city court jurisdiction; to provide with respect to jurisdiction over cases in which the state or a parish, municipal, or other political corporation is a defendant; to authorize the City Court of Slidell to have jurisdiction over certain petitions for nullity; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. Code of Civil Procedure Article 4847(A)(6) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Art. 4847. Limitations upon jurisdiction

A. Except as otherwise provided by law, a parish court or city court has no jurisdiction in any of the following cases or proceedings:

* * *

(6) A case in which the state, or a parish, municipal, or other political corporation is a defendant, except for a petition for nullity filed in the City Court of Slidell to nullify a judgment of bond forfeiture rendered by the City Court of Slidell.
