AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact Code of Civil Procedure Article 4847(A)(6), relative to certain
3	limitations on city court jurisdiction; to provide with respect to jurisdiction over
4	cases in which the state or a parish, municipal, or other political corporation is a
5	defendant; to authorize the City Court of Slidell to have jurisdiction over certain
6	petitions for nullity; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. Code of Civil Procedure Article 4847(A)(6) is hereby amended and
9	reenacted to read as follows:
10	Art. 4847. Limitations upon jurisdiction
11	A. Except as otherwise provided by law, a parish court or city court has no
12	jurisdiction in any of the following cases or proceedings:
13	* * *
14	(6) A case in which the state, or a parish, municipal, or other political
15	corporation is a defendant, except for a petition for nullity filed in the City Court of
16	Slidell to nullify a judgment of bond forfeiture rendered by the City Court of Slidell.
