KEYWORD AND SUMMARY AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

MEDICAID: Provides relative to annual reports on the Coordinated Care Network program and for termination of the program. (gov sig)

SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

- 1. Deleted <u>proposed law</u> provisions regarding legislative actions to determine whether authority for the program should be terminated.
- 2. Provided for termination of program authority on Dec. 31, 2014, after which date the department shall administer the services.
- 3. Modified a provision of proposed law requiring that CCNs report the number of claims denied due to certain reasons to include a requirement that CCNs report the number of claims denied or reduced for those reasons.
- 4. Added the following to the reasons enumerated in proposed law for which CCNs must report the number of claims denied or reduced: Due to process, procedure, notification, referrals, or any other required administrative function of a coordinated care network.
- 5. Technical.

DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that beginning January 1, 2013, and annually thereafter, the Department of Health and Hospitals shall submit an annual report concerning the Louisiana Medicaid Coordinated Care Network program to the Senate and House committees on health and welfare which shall include certain information as provided for in <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires DHH to submit all quarterly reports submitted by the coordinated care networks to the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare, House Committee on Health and Welfare, Senate Committee on Finance, and the House Committee on Appropriations.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that all authority for that portion of the Louisiana Medical Assistance Program which is administered by a coordinated care program, or meets the definition of managed care pursuant to federal law or regulation, excluding those portions which provide for behavioral health services, shall terminate on December 31, 2014. After that date, the department shall administer the services encompassed by the portion terminated herein according to rules and regulations promulgated prior to the establishment of the coordinated care program within the Louisiana Medical Assistance Program.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
