

New law requires the secretary for DPS&C to issue special prestige license plates to be known as the "Louisiana Seafood" license plate.

New law provides that the prestige license plate shall be issued, upon application, to any citizen of La. in the same manner as any other motor vehicle license plate.

New law provides for the La. Seafood Promotion and Marketing Board to select the color and design of the "Louisiana Seafood" license plate in accordance with new law.

New law provides that the fee for the license plate shall be the standard registration license fee and a handling fee of \$3.50 to be retained by the department to offset a portion of administrative costs. Further provides that an annual royalty fee of \$25 shall be collected, by the department every two years upon renewal of the plate, and deposited into the La. Seafood Promotion and Marketing Fund. The monies received from the royalty fees shall be used to implement the duties and functions of the board related to promotion and marketing as provided for in new law.

New law provides that the secretary shall adopt rules and regulations to implement the provisions provided in new law.

New law requires the secretary for DPS&C to issue special prestige license plates to be known as the "Hospice" license plate.

New law provides that the prestige license plate shall be issued, upon application, to any citizen of La. in the same manner as any other motor vehicle license plate.

New law provides for the LA Hospice Organization to select the color and design of the "Hospice" license plate in accordance with new law.

New law provides that the fee for the license plate shall be the standard registration license fee and a handling fee of \$3.50 to be retained by the department to offset a portion of administrative costs. Further provides that an annual royalty fee of \$25 shall be collected, by the department every two years upon renewal of the plate, and forwarded to the Louisiana Hospice Organization. The monies received from the royalty fees shall be used solely by the Louisiana Hospice Organization for the purpose of furthering its mission to improve hospice and end-of-life care through research, professional and public education, and public awareness.

New law provides that the secretary shall adopt rules and regulations to implement the provisions provided in new law.
