Kleckley (HB 259) Act No. 17

With respect to motor vehicle liability insurance, <u>prior law</u> required an owner's policy of liability insurance to insure the named insured and any other insured person using the motor vehicle with permission of the named insured against damages arising from ownership, maintenance, or use of such motor vehicle subject to limits exclusive of interests and costs with respect to each motor vehicle as follows:

- (1) \$15,000 for bodily injury to or death of one person in any one accident.
- (2) Subject to said limit of one person, \$30,000 because of bodily injury to or death of two or more persons in any one accident.
- (3) \$25,000 because of bodily injury to or destruction of property of others in any one accident.

<u>New law</u> changes the \$25,000 limit <u>from</u> coverage for bodily injury or destruction of property of others in any one accident <u>to</u> coverage for damage to or destruction of property of others in any one accident. Otherwise retains <u>prior law</u>.

Effective August 15, 2011.
