ELECTION CODE: Provides relative to hours polls are required to be open on election day

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 18:134(E) and 541, relative to voting; to provide for the hours
3 of voting; to provide for the time for opening of the polls; to provide for the hours
4 of the principal office of the registrar on election day; and to provide for related
5 matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 18:134(E) and 541 are hereby amended and reenacted to read as
8 follows:

9 §134. Office hours

10 * * *

11 E. On election days the principal office of the registrar shall remain open
12 from ~~6:00~~ 7:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. The registrar or a deputy registrar designated
13 by him shall remain in the office during that time.

14 * * *

15 §541. Opening and closing of the polls

16 In the primary and general elections, the polls shall open at ~~6:00~~ 7:00 a.m. on
17 election day and shall close at 8:00 p.m. on election day.

18 Section 2. This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2013.

Abstract: Establishes new election day poll hours, with the polls to open at 7:00 a.m. instead of 6:00 a.m.; requires the principal office of the registrar to open on election day at 7:00 a.m. instead of 6:00 a.m.

Present law provides that the polls shall open at 6:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m. on election day and that any voter in line to vote at 8:00 p.m. shall be allowed to vote.

Proposed law provides that the polls shall open at 7:00 a.m. instead of 6:00 a.m. Otherwise retains present law.

Present law requires the principal office of the registrar to remain open from 6:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. on election day. Requires the registrar or a deputy registrar designated by him to remain in the office during that time.

Proposed law provides that the principal office of the registrar shall open at 7:00 a.m. instead of 6:00 a.m. Otherwise retains present law.

Effective Jan. 1, 2013.
