HOUSE BILL NO. 581

CRIMINAL/BAIL: Provides for the reinstatement of bail in certain cases

1 AN ACT

2 To enact Code of Criminal Procedure Article 334.4, relative to bail; to provide for the
3 reinstatement of bail in certain cases; to provide for the circumstances in which bail
4 may be reinstated; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. Code of Criminal Procedure Article 334.4 is hereby enacted to read as
7 follows:

8 Art. 334.4. Reinstatement of bail following dismissal of case by prosecution;
9 conditions

10 A. When the district attorney dismisses an indictment or information and
11 institutes a subsequent indictment or information for the same offense or for a lesser
12 offense based on the same facts, the court shall reinstate any bail discharged when
13 the district attorney dismissed the initial indictment or information if the surety
14 consents to the reinstatement.

15 B. If the defendant voluntarily appears in court for the subsequent indictment
16 or information at the first hearing for which he received actual notice, proof of which
17 appears of record, the court shall permit the defendant to remain released for five
18 days, excluding weekends, to obtain the consent of the surety.

19 C. Nothing in this Article limits the court's authority to increase or reduce
20 bail pursuant to Article 342.

Abstract: Provides for the reinstatement of bail in cases where the prosecution has dismissed criminal charges if the surety agrees.

Present law provides for the setting of bail by the court in criminal cases.

Proposed law retains present law and further provides that in cases where the district attorney dismisses an indictment or information and institutes a subsequent indictment or information for the same offense or for a lesser offense based on the same facts, the court shall reinstate any bail discharged when the district attorney dismissed the initial indictment or information if the surety consents to the reinstatement.

Proposed law provides that if the defendant voluntarily appears in court for the subsequent indictment or information at the first hearing for which he received actual notice, proof of which appears of record, the court shall permit the defendant to remain released for five days, excluding weekends, to obtain the consent of the surety.
