HOUSE BILL NO. 822

FUNDS/FUNDING: Provides for the transfer and deposit of monies among state funds

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 22:842, relative to special treasury funds; to provide for deposits
3 into the Louisiana Medical Assistance Trust Fund; to provide for the transfer,
4 dedication, use, and appropriations as specified of certain treasury funds; to provide
5 for the deposit of certain funds into the state treasury; to provide for effective dates;
6 and to provide for related matters.

7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

8 Section 1. R.S. 22:842 is hereby amended and enacted to read as follows:

9 §842. Life, accident, health, or service insurance

10 A. Upon the business of issuing life, accident, health, or service insurance
11 policies, or other forms of contracts or obligations covering such risks, or issuing
12 endowment policies on contracts, or other similar forms of contract obligations, the
13 minimum annual tax shall be one hundred forty dollars when the gross annual
14 premiums are seven thousand dollars or less. When the gross annual premiums are
15 more than seven thousand dollars, the amount of tax payable shall be increased to
16 two hundred twenty-five dollars for each additional ten thousand dollars, or fraction
17 thereof, of gross annual premiums. The business of issuing each of the kinds of
18 insurance or contracts mentioned in this Section may be combined under one tax, and
19 the amount of the tax shall be based on the combined gross annual premiums of all
20 such businesses.

1 B. Taxes collected under the provision of this Section from health care
2 premium assessments paid by Medicaid-enrolled managed care organizations, after
3 first having been credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund as required by
4 Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, shall be deposited into the
5 Louisiana Medical Assistance Trust Fund.

6 Section 2.(A) After satisfying the requirements of the Bond Security and
7 Redemption Fund as provided in Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana,
8 the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to transfer all loan payments received
9 from political subdivisions, except from the city of New Orleans, under Section 7 of Act No.
10 41 of the 2006 First Extraordinary Session of the Legislature, of at least Eighty Four Million
11 Four Hundred Six Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-Seven Dollars, to the Medical Assistance
12 Trust Fund.

13 (B) Notwithstanding any provision of the law to the contrary, the state treasurer is
14 hereby authorized and directed to transfer the following amounts into the Louisiana Medical
15 Assistance Trust Fund:

17 Foundation Fund.

18 (2) Forty-One Thousand Three Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars from the Automobile

15 (C) After satisfying the requirements of the Bond Security and Redemption Fund
16 as provided in Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, the requirements
17 of R.S. 46:440.1, the Medical Assistance Programs Fraud Detection Fund, and the
18 requirements of R.S. 49:259, the Department of Justice Legal Support Fund, and after
19 deposit into the state general fund, then the treasurer shall transfer into the Medical
20 Assistance Trust Fund, provided for in R.S. 39:100.21, an amount equal to the settlement
21 funds or proceeds recovered by the attorney general on behalf of the state related to any
22 cause of action mentioned or raised in any suit involving Average Wholesale Price (AWP)
23 filed by, or on behalf of, the State of Louisiana against Dey Pharma, a subsidiary of Mylan,
24 Inc.; Schering-Plough or Merck & Co.; Boehringer Ingelheim GmbH; and/or Actavis Group,
25 including any affiliated, precursor, "formerly known as", and/or successor entities. To the
26 extent that in satisfying the requirements of R.S. 49:259, the Department of Justice Legal
27 Support Fund, any monies from these settlement funds or proceeds are paid into the
28 Department of Justice Legal Support Fund, a like amount shall be transferred from the
29 Department of Justice Legal Support Fund into the Medical Assistance Trust Fund.

1 Section 3.(A) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Ernest N.
2 Morial New Orleans Exhibition Hall Authority or its successor is hereby authorized and
3 directed to deposit into the state treasury the unrestricted or unencumbered fund balances of
4 Twenty Million Dollars. The state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to transfer the
5 funds to the Medical Assistance Trust Fund.

6 (B) After satisfying the requirements of the Bond Security and Redemption Fund
7 as provided in Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, the state treasurer
8 is hereby authorized and directed to transfer all loan payments received from political
9 subdivisions, except from the city of New Orleans, under Section 7 of Act No. 41 of the
10 2006 First Extraordinary Session of the Legislature, of at least Twenty-Five Million Nine
11 Hundred Seventy-Eight Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty-One Dollars, to the Medical
12 Assistance Trust Fund.

13 (C) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Louisiana Housing
14 Finance Agency or its successor is hereby authorized and directed to deposit into the state
15 treasury the unrestricted or encumbered fund assets of Eleven Million Dollars. The state
16 treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to transfer the funds to the Louisiana Medical
17 Assistance Trust Fund.

18 (D) Notwithstanding any provision of the law to the contrary, the state treasurer is
19 hereby authorized and directed to transfer the following amounts into the Louisiana Medical
20 Assistance Trust Fund from the funds specified below. The treasurer shall make such
21 transfers from each fund after fully funding the appropriation from the fund:

22 (1) Ninety-Six Thousand Seven Hundred Forty-Three Dollars from the
23 Administrative Fund of the Department of Insurance.

24 (2) One Hundred Sixty-Six Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-Six Dollars from the
25 Derelict Crab Trap Removal Program Account.

26 (3) Three Million Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars from the Incentive Fund.

27 (4) Three Million Forty-Four Thousand Six Hundred Ninety Dollars from the
28 Louisiana Fire Marshal Fund.

1 (5) Twenty-One Thousand Four Hundred Eighty-Five Dollars from the Louisiana
2 Help Our Wildlife Fund.

3 (6) Thirty-Four Thousand Two Hundred Eighty-Eight Dollars from the Motor Carrier
4 Regulation Fund.

5 (7) Six Million Dollars from the Office of Motor Vehicles Customer Service and
6 Technology Fund.

7 (8) Sixty-One Dollars from the Reptile and Amphibian Research Fund.

8 (9) Thirteen Million One Hundred Fifty-Five Thousand Fourteen Dollars from the
9 Riverboat Gaming Enforcement Fund.

10 (10) Three Hundred Eight Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-Seven Dollars from the
11 Seafood Promotion and Marketing Fund.

12 (11) Twenty Million Dollars from the Self-Insurance Fund.

13 (12) Eighty Thousand Six Hundred Forty Dollars from the Shrimp Trade Petition
14 Account.

15 (13) One Hundred Nineteen Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars from the Telephonic
16 Solicitation Relief Fund.

17 (14) One Million Seven Hundred Twenty-Four Thousand Two Hundred Eighty-Five
18 Dollars from the Traumatic Head and Spinal Cord Injury Trust Fund.

19 (15) One Million Four Hundred Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars from the
20 Utility and Carrier Inspection and Supervision Fund.

21 Section 4.(A) After satisfying the requirements of the Bond Security and
22 Redemption Fund as provided in Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana,
23 the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to transfer all loan payments received
24 from the city of New Orleans under Section 7 of Act No. 41 of the 2006 First Extraordinary
25 Session of the Legislature, of at least One Million Two Hundred Twelve Thousand Six
26 Hundred Thirty-One Dollars, to the Overcollections Fund.

27 (B) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the state treasurer is
28 hereby authorized and directed to transfer all proceeds from the sale of New Orleans
29 Adolescent Hospital of at least Thirty-Five Million Dollars to the Overcollections Fund.

1 Section 5. After satisfying the requirements of the Bond Security and Redemption
2 Fund as provided in Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, the state
3 treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to transfer all loan payments received from the
4 city of New Orleans under Section 7 of Act No. 41 of the 2006 First Extraordinary Session
5 of the Legislature, of at least Four Million Eight Hundred Fifty-Six Thousand One Hundred
6 Forty-Nine Dollars, to the Overcollections Fund.

7 Section 6.(A) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the state
8 treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to transfer all proceeds from the sale of the
9 Avoyelles Correctional Facility of Thirty-Five Million Dollars to the Budget Stabilization
10 Fund. The state treasurer is further authorized and directed to transfer all proceeds
11 exceeding Thirty-Five Million Dollars to the Louisiana Medical Assistance Trust Fund.

12 (B) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the state treasurer is
13 hereby authorized and directed to transfer all proceeds from the sale of the former Insurance
14 Building site, including existing parking structure, of Five Million Dollars to the Budget
15 Stabilization Fund. The state treasurer is further authorized and directed to transfer all such
16 proceeds exceeding Five Million Dollars to the Louisiana Medical Assistance Trust Fund.

17 (C) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the state treasurer is
18 hereby authorized and directed to transfer FEMA reimbursements of Ten Million Dollars
19 to the Budget Stabilization Fund.

20 Section 7. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the state treasurer
21 is hereby authorized and directed to transfer the following amounts into the State General
22 Fund:

23 (1) Three Million Seven Hundred Twenty-Two Thousand Three Hundred Fifteen
24 Dollars from the Adult Probation and Parole Officer Retirement Fund.

25 (2) Eight Hundred Sixty-Four Thousand One Hundred Seventy-Six Dollars from the
26 Academic Improvement Fund.

27 Section 8. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the state treasurer
28 shall not include unexpended and unencumbered monies in the Rapid Response Fund at the
29 end of the 2011-2012 Fiscal Year in the determination of the unencumbered balance of the

1 fund for purposes of determining the amount to be deposited into the fund at the beginning
2 of the fiscal year pursuant to R.S. 51:2361(A)(2).

3 Section 9. Sections 1, 2, 4, 7, 9, and 10 of this Act shall become effective upon
4 signature of this Act by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of
5 the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article
6 III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If this Act is vetoed by the governor and
7 subsequently approved by the legislature, Sections 1, 2, 4, and 7 through 10 of this Act shall
8 become effective on the day following such approval.

9 Section 10. Section 3, 5, 6, and 8 of this Act shall become effective on July 1, 2012;
10 if vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall
11 become effective on July 1, 2012, or on the day following such approval by the legislature,
12 whichever is later.

Abstract: Provides for the transfer and deposit of monies among state funds.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TRUST FUND

Present law provides for insurance premium taxes based on gross annual premiums.

Effective upon signature of the governor, proposed law requires insurance premium taxes from health care premium assessments paid by Medicaid-enrolled managed care organizations to be deposited into the La. Medical Assistance Trust Fund (MATF).

Effective upon signature of the governor, authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer to the Medical Assistance Trust Fund at least \$84,406,697 from all loan payments received from political subdivisions, except from the city of New Orleans, under §7 of Act No. 41 of the 2006 First E.S.

Effective upon signature of the governor, authorizes the state treasurer to transfer the following amounts into the Medical Assistance Trust Fund from the following funds:

Effective July 1, 2012, authorizes and directs the Ernest N. Morial New Orleans Exhibition Hall Authority or its successor to deposit into the state treasury the unrestricted or

unencumbered fund balances of \$20,000,000. Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer such funds to the Medical Assistance Trust Fund.

Effective July 1, 2012, authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer to the Medical Assistance Trust Fund all loan payments received from political subdivisions, except from the city of New Orleans, under Section 7 of Act No. 41 of the 2006 First E.S., of at least \$25,978,881.

Effective July 1, 2012, authorizes and directs the La. Housing Finance Agency or its successor to deposit into the state treasury the unrestricted or encumbered fund assets of \$11,000,000. Authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer the funds to the La. Medical Assistance Trust Fund.

Effective July 1, 2012, authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer the following amounts into the La. Medical Assistance Trust Fund from the following funds:

OVERCOLLECTIONS FUND

Effective upon signature of the governor, authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer all loan payments received from the city of New Orleans under §7 of Act No. 41 of the 2006 First E.S., of at least \$1,212,631, to the Overcollections Fund.

Effective upon signature of the governor, authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer all proceeds from the sale of New Orleans Adolescent Hospital of at least \$35,000,000 to the Overcollections Fund.

Effective July 1, 2012, authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer all loan payments received from the city of New Orleans under §7 of Act No. 41 of the 2006 First E.S., of at least \$4,856,149, to the Overcollections Fund.

BUDGET STABILIZATION FUND

Effective July 1, 2012, authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer all proceeds from the sale of the Avoyelles Correctional Facility of \$35,000,000 to the Budget Stabilization Fund. The state treasurer is further authorized and directed to transfer all proceeds exceeding \$35,000,000 to the La. Medical Assistance Trust Fund.

Effective July 1, 2012, authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer all proceeds from the sale of the former Insurance Building site, including existing parking structure, of \$5,000,000 to the Budget Stabilization Fund. Further authorizes and directs the state

treasurer to transfer all such proceeds exceeding \$5,000,000 to the La. Medical Assistance Trust Fund.

Effective July 1, 2012, authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer FEMA reimbursements of \$10,000,000 to the Budget Stabilization Fund.

STATE GENERAL FUND

Effective upon signature of the governor, authorizes and directs the state treasurer to transfer the following amounts into the State General Fund from the following funds:
