Amendments proposed by House Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works to Original House Bill No. 696 by Representative St. Germain

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 1, line 2, after "R.S." delete "405,"

3 AMENDMENT NO. 2

4 On page 1, line 3, after "408.1(5)" insert "and 414(K)(3)"

5 AMENDMENT NO. 3

6 On page 1, line 13, after "(e)", insert "(i)"

7 AMENDMENT NO. 4

8 On page 1, line 16, at the end of the line, delete the comma "," and insert a period ".".

9 AMENDMENT NO. 5

10 On page 1, delete lines 17 and 18 in their entirety and insert the following:

11 "(ii) The office of motor vehicles shall submit fingerprint cards or other
 12 identifying information of the principal of any third-party tester or examiner who has
 13 or is seeking a contract to administer commercial driving examinations and tests
 14 pursuant to R.S. 32:408.1 to the bureau. The bureau shall, upon request and after
 15 receipt of fingerprint cards or other identifying information from the office of motor
 16 vehicles, make available to the office of motor vehicles all arrest and conviction
 17 information contained in the bureau's criminal history record and identification files
 18 which pertains to the principal. In addition, in order to determine a principal's
 19 eligibility or suitability, the fingerprints shall be forwarded by the bureau to the
 20 Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record check.

21 (iii) The office of motor vehicles may submit fingerprint cards or other
 22 identifying information of a person seeking employment with the office of motor
 23 vehicles whose duties will include the issuance of commercial drivers' licenses or
 24 any current office of motor vehicles employee who as part of his employment issues
 25 commercial driver's licenses. The bureau shall, upon request and after receipt of
 26 fingerprint cards or other identifying information from the office of motor vehicles,
 27 make available to the office of motor vehicles all arrest and conviction information
 28 contained in the bureau's criminal history record and identification files which
 29 pertains to the employee or potential employee. In addition, in order to determine
 30 an employee or potential employee's eligibility or suitability, the fingerprints shall
 31 be forwarded by the bureau to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national
 32 criminal history record check."
