CRIME/MISDEMEANOR

OR INCREASE LF RV See Note

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Prohibits the sale of dogs or cats at certain public locations

Proposed legislation provides that it shall be unlawful for any person to offer for sale, sell, offer for exchange, exchange, offer for donation, or donate any live dog or cat on any highway, right-of-way, public park, public playground, public swimming pool, any other public recreational area, flea market, commercial or retail parking lot, or adjacent property to such locations. Proposed legislation creates exceptions for dog or cat adoption days sponsored by animal welfare groups and sales occurring entirely on private property. Proposed legislation provides penalties of a fine of not more than \$250 for a first violation and not more than \$1,000 for second or subsequent violations.
