Requires local option elections in local school districts on term limits for school board members

Legislation provides for an election in every school district, with limited exceptions, on Nov. 6, 2012, to determine whether the members of the school board in each district shall have term limits. Specifies the ballot language to be used in the election and requires the secretary of state to prepare the ballot. Proposed law is not applicable to the Recovery School District, the governing authority of any charter school, and school districts where voters have already approved term limits. Requires the costs for this election to be borne by the state. Effective upon governor's signature.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. The legislation provides for local option elections to determine whether members of the school board shall be term limited and would be held at the November 6, 2012 statewide election. The addition of a state paid item on the ballot will not increase election expenses. The Secretary of State’s budget includes funding for statewide items to be included on the ballot. Costs for this election are included in HB1 in the amount of \$13 M. The date proposed in this legislation is the same date as the presidential and congressional primary elections.
