ENVIRONMENT/WASTE SITES: Provides for reimbursement for processing waste tires

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 30:2418(I)(2), relative to recycling waste tires; to provide for
3 payment to waste tire processors; and to provide for related matters.

4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

5 Section 1. R.S. 30:2418(I)(2) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

6 §2418. Waste tires

10 (2) A permitted waste tire processing facility shall be paid a minimum of ~~one~~
11 ~~dollar and fifty~~ seven and a half cents per ~~twenty pounds~~ pound of waste tire material
12 that is recycled or that reaches end-market uses ~~or per twenty pounds of whole waste~~
13 ~~tires marketed and shipped to a qualified recycler.~~ This payment shall be
14 conditioned on the facility providing to the department any documentation, including
15 but not limited to manifests, statements, or certified scale-weight tickets, required by
16 law or by rules and regulations promulgated by the department.

HB No. 1067

Abstract: Provides for the payment to waste tire processors.

Present law requires that waste tire processing facility be paid by DEQ a minimum of \$1.50 per 20 lbs. of waste tire material, which equals 7-½¢ per pound, that is recycled or that reaches end-market uses or per 20 lbs. of whole waste tires marketed and shipped to a qualified recycler.

Proposed law changes the calculation of the payment to waste tire processing facilities to 7-½¢ per pound of waste tire material that is recycled or that reaches end-market uses.

Present law conditions payment on the facility providing to DEQ any documentation, including but not limited to manifests, statements, or certified scale-weight tickets, required by law or by rules and regulations promulgated by the department.

Proposed law retains present law.
