HB No. 1102

Abstract: Authorizes the secretary to annually disclose, beginning Sept. 1, 2012, the name, address, and last four digits of a taxpayer's social security number to the La. Clerks' of Court Association.

Present law provides for the confidentiality of taxpayer records and for exceptions under which information may be shared with other public entities.

Proposed law retains present law and adds an exception, beginning of Sept. 1, 2012, for the disclosure of a list which contains only the name, address, and last four digits of a taxpayer's social security number to the La. Clerk's of Court Association, hereinafter "association". Further provides for annual disclosure of the list, which shall be in an electronic format without cost to the association.

Proposed law requires that upon written request of any district clerk of court, the association shall provide to the clerk the electronic list for the respective parish. Further provides that the list shall not be considered a public record; however, the jury venire roll constructed by the district clerk of court shall be considered a public record.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Ways and Means to the original bill.

1. Deleted provision specifying that the purpose of the list is to assist the parish clerks of court in constructing and maintaining jury rolls.
2. Added provision that annual disclosure of the list by the secretary shall begin Sept. 1, 2012, and that the list shall be provided in an electronic format without cost to the association.
3. Required the electronic parish list to be provided to the district clerk of court upon written request to the association.
4. Added provision that the list from the secretary shall not be considered a public

record; however, the jury venire roll constructed by the district clerk of court shall be considered a public record.
