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Prohibits the use of a cellular telephone while driving

<u>Proposed legislation</u> deletes the phrase and definition of "write, send, or read a text-based communication" and replaces it with the phrase "using a wireless telecommunications device" and defines it.

<u>Proposed legislation</u> provides for exemption of an electronic communications device when used as a hands free device.

<u>Proposed legislation</u> defines "use" of a wireless telephone or electronic communication device to include but not be limited to talking or listening to another person on the telephone, text messaging, or sending an electronic message via the wireless telephone or electronic communication device.

Proposed legislation provides that texting while drive shall constitute a moving violation.

Proposed legislation provides that any violation constitutes a primary offense.

Proposed legislation repeals R.S. 32:289.1, 300.6 and 300.7.
