Authorizes an increase in court costs for municipal ordinance violations in the mayor's court in the town of Sterlington

Purpose of Bill: This measure authorizes the Mayor's Court of Sterlington to impose additional court costs not to exceed \$10 for each offense. This additional revenue is to be allocated to the Sterlington Police Department.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this bill.

This bill does not directly provide for additional expenditures. However, a town official informed us that there are plans to use the revenue for police department equipment.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

This bill may increase local governmental revenues for the Town of Sterlington by approximately \$12,400 annually.

Officials with the Town of Sterlington indicated that this bill may increase town revenues by approximately \$12,400 annually (\$10 court cost x 1,240 paid citations per year).
