

1 WHEREAS, the impact of providing specifically by statute for "dual paternity" in
2 child support cases but not in other areas of the law could create results by implication; and

3 WHEREAS, since the charge of the Child Support Review Committee is to study the
4 child support guidelines and make recommendations for modification and the charge of the
5 Marriage and Persons Committee is to consider all other areas of the law impacted by "dual
6 paternity", the review and consideration of both committees is desirable.

7 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
8 request that the Louisiana State Law Institute Marriage and Persons Advisory Committee
9 consider statutory proposals in the areas of the law in which "dual paternity" may have an
10 impact not otherwise resolvable and to make specific recommendations for legislation.

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Marriage and Persons Advisory Committee
12 report its findings to the Child Support Review Committee at least sixty days prior to
13 presentation of the Marriage and Persons Committee report to the legislature.

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee report its findings and
15 recommendations in the form of specific proposed legislation to the legislature at least sixty
16 days prior to the beginning of the 2013 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana.

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted
18 to the Marriage and Persons Advisory Committee of the Louisiana State Law Institute.
