CHILDREN/SUPPORT: Provides relative to suspension of licenses for failure to pay child support obligations.

DIGEST

Present law provides for the suspension of a license for failure to pay child support to be lifted when the obligor is in compliance with the support order.

Proposed law retains present law and provides for lifting or modification of a suspension when the obligor is in partial compliance.

Present law requires the licensing authority to reinstate a license of an obligor which has been suspended for failure to pay child support once the obligor is in compliance with a support order.

Proposed law retains present law and provides that a license shall be reinstated once the obligor is in partial compliance with the child support order.

- 1. Added provision requiring the department to lift the suspension of any license if ordered by the judge presiding over the child support matter, provided there is no reason for suspension other than the failure to pay child support.
