## HOUSE SUMMARY OF SENATE AMENDMENTS

House Bill No. 1092 by Representative Fannin

REVENUE DEPARTMENT: Authorizes the Dept. of Revenue to make payment of tax refunds by means of a debit card at the option of the taxpayer

## **Synopsis of Senate Amendments**

1. Adds a provision that the Act shall be effective for taxable years 2013, 2014, and 2015.

## Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the secretary of the Dept. of Revenue to pay refunds for overpayments of tax. Refund payments are made from the current collections of taxes imposed by <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and requires the paper form of the individual income tax return to provide the following options for receipt of a refund: check, debit card, direct deposit, or any other format by which the department may pay a refund. A taxpayer who files a paper tax return may select the payment method for his refund. If a tax return does not reflect the selection of a specific method of payment by the taxpayer, the refund shall be paid in a manner determined by the secretary.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the payment of tax refunds by use of a debit card at the option of the taxpayer.

Makes provisions of the Act effective for taxable years 2013, 2014, and 2015.
