
SENATE FLOOR AMENDMENTS

Amendments proposed by Senator LaFleur to Engrossed House Bill No. 1105 by Representative Katrina Jackson

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 1, line 2, after "R.S." delete the remainder of the line and delete lines 3 through 5
3 and insert the following:

4 "33:4562.4, relative to special service districts; to provide relative to certain
5 recreational districts; to provide for membership of the board of
6 commissioners; to authorize certain officers of the board to receive
7 compensation; to provide relative to revenue generated by assets of the
8 district; to provide for an advisory committee; to provide for an effective
9 date; and to provide"

10 AMENDMENT NO. 2

11 On page 1, line 8, after "R.S." change "46:1053(FF)" to "33:4562.4"

12 AMENDMENT NO. 3

13 On page 1, delete lines 9 through 19 and on page 2, delete lines 1 through 3 and insert the
14 following:

15 "§4562.4. Certain recreational districts

16 A. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the
17 provisions of this Section shall apply to any recreational district located in
18 a parish with a population of not less than thirty-three thousand five hundred
19 and not more than thirty-five thousand according to the latest federal
20 decennial census.

21 B. The recreational district shall be governed by a board of
22 commissioners, composed of nine members who shall be qualified voters and
23 residents of the area contained in the district. The members of the board, who
24 shall serve one-year terms, shall be appointed as follows:

25 (1) Three members shall be appointed by the governing authority of
26 the parish in which the district is located.

27 (2) Three members shall be appointed by the board of aldermen of the
28 most populous municipality located in the parish according to the latest
29 federal decennial census, with the concurrence of the mayor of the
30 municipality.

31 (3) Three members shall be appointed jointly by the members of the
32 legislature who represent the representative or senatorial district or districts
33 in which the district is located.

34 C. The secretary and treasurer of the board of commissioners may
35 receive compensation for their services.

36 D. Revenue generated by the assets of the district may be allocated
37 to the promotion or sponsorship of athletic and health-related activities in the
38 district in addition to other matters provided by law.

39 E. The board of commissioners of the district may create an advisory
40 committee composed of the presidents or their designees of the various sports
41 leagues formally organized and located within the district. The purpose of
42 the advisory committee shall be to make recommendations to the board
43 regarding recreational programming and enrichment activities in the district.

44 Section 2. In the event of any conflict between the provisions of this Act and those
45 of any other Act adopted by the legislature at its Regular Session in 2012, regardless of
46 which Act is adopted later or signed later by the governor, the provisions of this Act shall
47 prevail.

Section 3. This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2013."
