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Creates the Louisiana Military Advisory Council

Proposed law creates the Louisiana Military Advisory Council which will consist of 25 council members, one from each branch of the military, along with government , economic development interests and others involved in national defense and homeland security businesses. The Council will replace the Governor’s Military Advisory Board, which is created annually by executive order. The Governor will appoint 19 of the members with the remaining 5 specified state government officials including the Governor, the adjutant general, Senate president, House speaker, Economic Development Secretary, and Veterans Affairs Secretary (or designees) with initially staggered terms but serving four year terms thereafter. The Council may spend the money that is donated or appropriated to it but has no taxing authority. Council members and military liaisons will not receive compensation, though public officials are eligible for reimbursement of travel expenses through their employing department, agency, or elected office, and a per diem may be sought by members of the Legislature. The Council is expected to provide a forum to enhance interaction between the military and civilian interests, including the impacts of base closures, troop deployments, and community compatibility, etc.

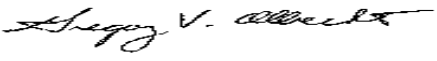

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

The Legislative, and governmental designees (Depts. of Economic Development and Veterans Affairs) may be obligated for certain travel and per diem expenses associated with meetings, which are scheduled twice per year with subcommittees meeting 8 times per year or as needed. These expenses would likely be minor and these agencies would absorb any such expenses within their current budgets unless incremental funding was provided. The council is authorized to receive and spend money from any source.
