

Prior law required a 17-year-old or older first-time Class "E" license applicant to provide a signed statement to the department attesting that the applicant had completed a minimum of 50 hours of supervised driving practice with a licensed parent, guardian, or adult of at least 21 years of age or older.

New law requires the following persons to submit a signed statement to the office of motor vehicles attesting that a first-time applicant for a Class "E" driver's license completed a minimum of 50 hours of supervised driving practice with a licensed parent, guardian, or adult of at least 21 years of age or older:

- (1) Parent or guardian of a seventeen-year-old applicant.
- (2) An emancipated seventeen-year-old applicant.
- (3) An eighteen-year-old or older applicant.

New law corrects name of federal law to "Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1986".

Effective August 1, 2012.
