ELECTIONS/COMMISSIONERS EN INCREASE GF EX See Note Page 1 of 1  
Increases the compensation of absentee by mail and early voting commissioners for certain elections

The proposed legislation provides for a permissive increase for absentee by mail and early voting commissioners who serve during election day from \$50 to \$100 when requested by the parish board of election supervisors and approved by the secretary of state.

**EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

The proposed legislation will result in an indeterminable increase in state general fund expenditures. The LFO cannot predict the number of early voting and absentee commissioners that may be requested by the parish board of elections supervisors and subsequently approved by the secretary of state for elections. A total of \$9,250 was expended for 185 absentee commissioners employed during the 2011 gubernatorial primary election. If the same number of absentee commissioners (185) are employed in future gubernatorial and congressional elections, the cost would double (\$18,500).

**REVENUE EXPLANATION**

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
