

Presently there are six justice of the peace courts in DeSoto Parish. Each elects a justice of the peace and a constable.

New law changes the territorial jurisdiction of the six justice of the peace courts in DeSoto Parish and therefore the election districts for justice of the peace and constable.

New law provides that the districts provided in new law shall be effective for election purposes with the opening of the qualifying period for the 2014 primary election for justice of the peace and constables and that the persons elected to the offices of justice of the peace and constable for such justice of the peace courts at the next regularly scheduled election and their successors shall be elected from the districts provided in new law. New law provides that the districts provided in new law shall be effective for all other purposes on Jan. 1, 2015.

New law specifies that precincts referenced in district descriptions are those precincts identified as Voting Districts (VTDs) in the 2010 Census Redistricting TIGER/Line Shapefiles for the parish of DeSoto, state of La. Also specifies that if any such precinct has been subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a nongeographic basis or subdivided by action of the parish governing authority on a geographic basis in accordance with existing law, the enumeration of the general precinct designation shall include all nongeographic and all geographic subdivisions thereof. Further provides that the territorial limits of the districts as enacted shall continue in effect without change regardless of any changes made to the precincts by the parish governing authority.
