AN ACT

To enact R.S. 40:4.13, relative the Sanitary Code; to provide exceptions to the Sanitary Code; to allow a not-for-profit entity or charitable organization to receive or use certain meats or fish for food or meal distribution at no cost to an individual; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 40:4.13 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§4.13. Not-for-profit entity or charitable organization; receive or use certain meats or fish in food or meal distribution
Notwithstanding any provisions of the state Sanitary Code or any other law or regulation to the contrary, it shall be lawful for a not-for-profit entity or a charitable organization to receive or use any commercial or game fish, migratory and resident game bird, game quadruped, as defined in R.S. 56:8, alligator, or feral hog in food or meal distribution at no cost to an individual.

Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If

1 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
2 effective on the day following such approval.

DIGEST

Proposed law allows a not-for-profit entity or a charitable organization to receive or use any commercial or game fish, migratory and resident game bird, game quadruped, as defined in R.S. 56:8, alligator, or feral hog in food or meal distribution at no cost to an individual.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
