## **DIGEST**

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that whenever an offender is convicted of first degree murder under <u>present law</u> and has been sentenced to life in prison without benefit of parole, probation or suspension of sentence, either in accordance with the determination of the jury or under <u>present law</u> relative to a plea of guilty in a capital case, the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections is to classify and incarcerate the offender in a manner affording maximum protection to the general public, the employees of the department, and the security of the institution for the complete duration of the offender's sentence.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that an offender incarcerated under the provisions of <u>proposed law</u> will not be permitted visitation rights or privileges except for legal counsel, medical, dental, and mental healthcare examinations and treatment, and a chaplain, priest or other spiritual director approved by the warden.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
