The original instrument and the following digest, which constitutes no part of the legislative instrument, were prepared by Margaret M. Corley.

DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> prohibits any person from operating a motor vehicle upon any public road or highway of this state while using a wireless telecommunications device to write, send, or read a text-based communication.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further prohibits any person from operating a motor vehicle upon any public road or highway of this state while using a wireless telecommunications device to access, read, or post to a social networking site.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines the "access, read, or post to a social networking site" as using a wireless telecommunications device to view any web-based service that allows individuals to construct a profile within a bounded system, articulate a list of other users with whom they share a connection, and communicate with other members of the site.

<u>Present law</u> provides that any violation of <u>present law</u> shall constitute a moving violation. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that using a wireless telecommunications device to access, read, or post to a social networking site shall constitute a moving violation.

Effective August 1, 2013.
