Repeals the Louisiana Science Education Act. (gov sig)

The proposed legislation will repeal the Louisiana Science Education Act as provided in R.S. 17:285.1. The Science Education Act, upon request of public school systems, requires the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to allow and assist teachers, principals and other school administrators to create and foster an environment in public elementary and secondary schools that promotes critical thinking skills, logical analysis, and open and objective discussion of scientific theories being studied including evolution, the origins of life, global warming, and human cloning.
