TRAFFIC. Prohibits any device from being used to access, read, or post to a social networking site while operating a motor vehicle. (8/1/13)

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 32:300.5(A) and the introductory paragraph of R.S. 32:300.5(B), relative to driver distractions; to prohibit social networking while operating a motor 3 4 vehicle; to provide for penalties; and to provide for related matters. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: Section 1. R.S. 32:300.5(A) and the introductory paragraph of R.S. 32:300.5(B) are 6 7 hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 8 §300.5. Use of certain wireless telecommunications devices for text messaging and 9 social networking prohibited 10 A.(1) Except as provided in Subsection B of this Section, no person shall 11 operate any motor vehicle upon any public road or highway of this state while using a wireless telecommunications device to write, send, or read a text-based 12 13 communication. For purposes of this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be 14 writing, reading, or sending a text message if the person reads, selects, or enters a telephone number or name in a wireless telecommunications device for the purpose 15 of making a telephone call. 16

(2) No person shall operate any motor vehicle upon any public road or

1 highway of this state while using a wireless telecommunications device to access, 2 read, or post to a social networking site. (3)(a) "Wireless telecommunications device" means a cellular telephone, a 3 text-messaging device, a personal digital assistant, a stand alone computer, or any 5 other substantially similar wireless device that is readily removable from the vehicle and is used to write, send, or read text or data through manual input. A "wireless 6 telecommunications device" shall not include any device or component that is 7 8 permanently affixed to a motor vehicle. It does not include citizens band radios, 9 citizens band radio hybrids, commercial two-way radio communication devices, or 10 electronic communication devices with a push-to-talk function. 11 (b) "Write, send, or read a text-based communication" means using a wireless telecommunications device to manually communicate with any person by using a 12 13 text-based communication referred to as a text message, instant message, or electronic mail. 14 (c) "Access, read, or post to a social networking site" means using a 15 wireless telecommunications device to access, read, or post on such device to any 16 web-based service that allows individuals to construct a profile within a 17 bounded system, articulate a list of other users with whom they share a 18 connection, and communicate with other members of the site. 19

<u>Present law</u> prohibits any person from operating a motor vehicle upon any public road or highway of this state while using a wireless telecommunications device to write, send, or read a text-based communication.

<u>Present law</u> excepts certain persons from prohibition of using a wireless telecommunications device to write, send, or read a text-based communication.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further prohibits any person from operating a motor vehicle upon any public road or highway of this state while using a wireless telecommunications device to access, read, or post to a social networking site.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines the "access, read, or post to a social networking site" as using a wireless telecommunications device to access, read, or post to any web-based service that allows individuals to construct a profile within a bounded system, articulate a list of other users with whom they share a connection, and communicate with other members of the site.

<u>Present law</u> provides that any violation of <u>present law</u> shall constitute a moving violation. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that using a wireless telecommunications device to access, read, or post to a social networking site shall constitute a moving violation.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

<u>Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works to the original bill</u>

- 1. Makes use of any device to access, read, or post to a social networking site while operating a motor vehicle applicable to all persons.
- 2. Revises definition of "access, read, or post to a social networking site" to mean using a wireless telecommunications device to access, read, or post to any web-based service.
