SPECIAL DISTRICTS. Creates and provides for the Southern Heights Neighborhood Crime Prevention District. (8/1/13)

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 33:9097.19, relative to East Baton Rouge Parish; to create a crime prevention	
3	and improvement district for the Southern Heights Neighborhood; to provide for the	
4	purpose and boundaries of the district; to provide for the governance of the district;	
5	to provide for the duties and powers of the district; to authorize for the levy of a	
6	parcel fee within the district; to provide for indemnity and exculpation of board	
7	members; and to provide for related matters.	
8	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.	
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:	
10	Section 1. R.S. 33:9097.19 is hereby enacted to read as follows:	
11	§9097.19. Southern Heights Neighborhood Crime Prevention and	
12	<u>Improvement District</u>	
13	A. Creation. There is hereby created within the parish of East Baton	
14	Rouge, as more specifically provided in Subsection B of this Section, a body	
15	politic and corporate which shall be known as the Southern Heights	
16	Neighborhood Crime Prevention and Improvement District, hereinafter	
17	referred to as the "district". The district shall be a political subdivision of the	

1	state as defined in the Constitution of Louisiana.
2	B. Boundaries. The boundaries of the district shall be coterminous with
3	the boundaries of the Southern Heights Neighborhood in East Baton Rouge
4	Parish as established in the official subdivision plat filed with the clerk of court
5	of East Baton Rouge Parish.
6	C. Purpose. The purpose of the district shall be to aid in crime
7	prevention and to add to the security of district residents by providing for an
8	increase in the presence of law enforcement personnel in the district and to
9	serve the needs of the residents of the district by funding beautification and
10	improvements for the overall betterment of the district.
11	D. Governance. (1) The district shall be governed by a board of
12	commissioners consisting of seven members as follows:
13	(a) The board of directors of the Southern Heights Property Owners
14	Association, Inc., shall appoint three members.
15	(b) The member or members of the Louisiana House of Representatives
16	who represent the area which comprises the district shall appoint one member.
17	(c) The member or members of the Louisiana Senate who represent the
18	area which comprises the district shall appoint one member.
19	(d) The assessor for the parish of East Baton Rouge shall appoint one
20	member.
21	(e) The Metro Council member or council members who represent the
22	district shall appoint one member.
23	(2) All members of the board shall own property and reside within the
24	district.
25	(3)(a) The terms of the members appointed pursuant to Subparagraph
26	(1)(a) of this Subsection shall be two years.
27	$\underline{(b)\ The\ terms\ of\ the\ members\ serving\ pursuant\ to\ Subparagraphs\ (1)(b)}$
28	through (e) of this Subsection shall be three years.
29	(4) The members of the board shall select from among themselves a

1	president and such other officers as they deem appropriate. The terms and
2	responsibilities of officers shall be as provided by the bylaws of the board.
3	(5) The members of the board shall serve without compensation and
4	shall not receive reimbursement for expenses.
5	E. Powers and duties. The district, acting through its board of
6	commissioners, shall have the following powers and duties:
7	(1) To sue and be sued.
8	(2) To adopt, use, and alter at will a corporate seal.
9	(3) To receive and expend funds collected pursuant to Subsection F and
10	in accordance with a budget adopted as provided by Subsection G of this
11	Section.
12	(4) To accept private grants and donations.
13	(5) To enter into contracts with individuals or entities, private or public,
14	for the provision of security patrols in the district.
15	(6) To purchase items and supplies which the board deems instrumental
16	to achieving the purpose of the district.
17	(7) To acquire, lease, insure, and sell real property within the
18	boundaries of the district in accordance with district plans.
19	(8) To perform or have performed any other function or activity
20	necessary for the achievement of the purpose of the district.
21	F. Parcel fee. The governing authority of East Baton Rouge Parish is
22	hereby authorized to impose and collect a parcel fee within the district subject
23	to and in accordance with the provisions of this Subsection:
24	(1)(a) The fee shall be imposed on each improved and unimproved
25	parcel located within the district.
26	(b) For the purposes of this Section, a parcel shall be defined as a lot, a
27	subdivided portion of ground, or an individual tract on which a residential or
28	commercial structure is situated; however, the term "parcel" shall not include
29	"condominium parcel" or "condominium property" as defined in R.S.

9:1121.103

(2)(a)(i) The initial amount of the fee shall be as requested by duly adopted resolution of the governing authority of the district. The initial fee shall not exceed one hundred dollars per parcel per year.

(ii) The fee shall be imposed only after the question of its imposition has been approved by a majority of the registered voters of the district voting on the proposition at an election held for that purpose in accordance with the Louisiana Election Code. No less than thirty days prior to any election held to approve such parcel fee, the board of commissioners shall mail notification of the upcoming election to each registered voter of the district and to the owner of a parcel if the owner is not a registered voter of the district.

(b) Not less than five years after approval of the parcel fee by a majority of the registered voters of the district, the governing authority of the district may increase the amount of the parcel fee one time without an election. The amount of the increased fee shall be as provided in a duly adopted resolution of the board, not to exceed one hundred fifty dollars per parcel per year.

(3) A parcel fee shall expire ten years after its levy but may be renewed if the renewal is approved by the voters in the manner provided in Subparagraph (2)(a) of this Subsection. The renewed fee shall not exceed one hundred fifty dollars per parcel per year. If renewed, the term of the imposition of the fee shall be as provided in the proposition authorizing such renewal, not to exceed ten years.

- (4) The owner of the parcel is responsible for payment of the fee.
- (5) The fee shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as ad valorem taxes are collected by the sheriff, as ex officio tax collector, of East Baton Rouge Parish. The sheriff shall collect and remit to the district all amounts collected not more than sixty days after collection. He shall retain as a commission the same percentage of collectable amounts as he receives for the collection of ad valorem taxes.

3 (3) To the fullest extent permitted by R.S. 9:2792 et seq., including R.S.
4 9:2792.1 through 2792.9, a person serving the district as a board member or
5 officer shall not be individually liable for any act or omission arising out of the
6 performance of his duties.

## **DIGEST**

Broome (SB 25)

<u>Proposed law</u> creates the Southern Heights Neighborhood Crime Prevention and Improvement District in East Baton Rouge Parish to aid in crime prevention and improvement of areas within the district. Further provides for the boundaries of the district.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for governance of the district by a seven-member board of commissioners, each of whom must reside within the district and be a registered voter in the district. Members of the board shall serve without compensation and shall serve terms of two or three years, as determined by <u>proposed law</u>.

Proposed law provides for the powers and duties of the district as follows:

- (1) To sue and be sued.
- (2) To adopt and use a corporate seal.
- (3) To receive and spend funds collected pursuant to <u>proposed law</u> in accordance with a budget adopted in accordance with <u>proposed law</u>.
- (4) To enter into contracts for security patrols or other programs in the district.
- (5) To perform other functions or activities necessary for achieving any purpose of the district.
- (6) To purchase items necessary to achieve any purpose of the district.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the levy, subject to voter approval, of a parcel fee on improved and unimproved parcels within the district. The fee shall be as provided by duly adopted resolution of the board and shall not exceed \$100 per parcel per year.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that not less than five years after voter approval, the governing authority of the district may increase the amount of the fee, without an election, not to exceed \$150 per parcel per year.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that the fee shall expire 10 years after its initial imposition, but may be renewed subject to voter approval.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the fee shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as ad valorem taxes are collected by the parish. Further provides that any parcel fee shall be enforced with the same authority and subject to the same penalties as ad valorem

taxes.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the adoption of an annual budget for the district and provides that the district shall be subject to audit by the legislative auditor.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that if the district ceases to exist, all funds of the district shall be transmitted to the governing authority of East Baton Rouge Parish and shall be used for law enforcement purposes in the area comprising the district.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for indemnification of board members by the district and limits board member liability for acts or omissions arising out of the performance of a member's duties.
