DIGEST

Ward (SB 18)

Proposed law provides no provision of the state sanitary code or any provision of any other law or regulation that requires any equipment, design, construction, utensils, supplies, preparation, or services will apply to the preparation of cakes and cookies in the home for sale.

Proposed law applies to any preparers of cakes and cookies that are made at a home for sale whose gross annual sales are less than \$50,000.

Proposed law provides any preparers of cakes and cookies that are made at a home for sale must register with the Department of Health and Hospitals.

Proposed law provides the department maintain an up-to-date registry on the department's website.

Proposed law provides any preparers of cakes and cookies that are made at a home for sale to the public are required to obtain a certificate from the National Registry of Food Safety Professionals.

Proposed law provides it is a misdemeanor for an individual to fail to register as required pursuant to the proposed law, and such misdemeanor is punishable upon conviction by a fine of not less than \$100 not greater than \$500.

Proposed law provides such misdemeanors shall be prosecuted by the district attorney of the judicial district in which the offender resides.

Effective August 1, 2013.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Health and Welfare to the original bill

1. Removes the requirements that the Department of Revenue provide certain information to the Department of Health and Hospitals and removes requirement for promulgation of related rules and regulations.

2. Requires the individual register with DHH on an annual basis and that DHH maintain a registry on its website.
3. Requires an individual selling cakes and cookies from home to receive a certificate from the National Registry of Food Safety Professionals.
4. Provides penalties for failure to register.
5. Technical changes.
