COASTAL PROTECT/RES AUTH. Requests the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority in conjunction with the Department of Natural Resources to document the costs of complying with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act in public infrastructure projects in the state of Louisiana.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 To urge and request the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority in conjunction with the Department of Natural Resources to document the cost of complying with 3 Section 404 of the Clean Water Act in public infrastructure projects in the state of 4 5 Louisiana. WHEREAS, the state of Louisiana is facing unprecedented challenges in preserving 7 and restoring its treasured coastline and wetlands, a challenge that requires the coordination 8 of federal, state, local, and private resources; and 9 WHEREAS, in 1972, the United States government passed the Clean Water Act, 10 which created a regulatory framework that oversees dredging, filling, or discharging into any 11 federal water body or any waters that are connected to or drains into any federal water body; and 12 13 WHEREAS, because of the tremendous challenges in protecting our communities 14 and fragile coastline, state and local governments have embarked on a number of projects that include dredging, drainage, and the building of levees; and 15 WHEREAS, Section 404 of the Clean Water Act requires these state and local 16 governments to navigate a complex regulatory scheme to receive permitting for any 17 18 dredging, filling or discharging into federal waters or any waters connected to federal waters,

and further requires the onerous mitigation of any wetlands impacted by such public infrastructure projects; and

WHEREAS, the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority is charged with achieving a sustainable coast that will protect our communities, the nation's critical energy infrastructure, and our bountiful natural resources for future generations; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Natural Resources is charged with preserving and enhancing the nonrenewable natural resources of the state through conservation, regulation, management, and development to ensure that the state realizes appropriate economic benefits from its asset base; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to enhance the ability of state and local governments to pursue public infrastructure projects that will protect the people of Louisiana, our wetlands, and fragile coast, it is necessary to document the unnecessary costs associated with complying with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act and in particular its mitigation requirements.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority in conjunction with the Department of Natural Resources to document the costs of complying with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the chair of the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority, the secretary of the Department of Natural Resources, the administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency, and the commanding general and chief of engineers of the United States Army Corps of Engineers.
