HOUSE BILL NO. 256

BY REPRESENTATIVE PATRICK WILLIAMS AND SENATOR JOHNS

Prefiled pursuant to Article III, Section 2(A)(4)(b)(i) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

TAX/PROPERTY: (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for the redemption period for blighted, abandoned, uninhabitable, or hazardous property sold at tax sale

A JOINT RESOLUTION

2	Proposing to add Article VII, Section 25(B)(3) of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to
3	tax sales occurring in certain parishes; to provide for the redemption period for
4	certain blighted or abandoned property sold at tax sale; to provide for submission of
5	the proposed amendment to the electors; and to provide for related matters.
6	Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members
7	elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of
8	Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to add
9	Article VII, Section(B)(3) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:

13	(B) Redemption.

15	(3) In any parish other than Orleans, when such property sold is vacant
16	residential or commercial property which has been declared blighted, as defined by
17	R.S. 33:1374(B)(1) on January 1, 2013, or abandoned, as defined by R.S.
18	33:4720.59(D)(2) on January 1, 2013, it shall be redeemable for eighteen months

Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at the election, 10 there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as 11 12 follows: 13 Do you support an amendment providing for an eighteen-month redemption 14 period in any parish other than Orleans, for vacant property sold at tax sale 15 which is blighted or abandoned? (Effective January 1, 2015) (Adds Article 16 VII, Section 25(B)(3)

Abstract: For purposes of tax sales in any parish other than Orleans, provides an 18-month redemption period for vacant property sold at tax sale which is blighted or abandoned.

<u>Present constitution</u> provides that property sold at a tax sale is redeemable for three years after the sale by paying the price given, plus costs, a 5% penalty, and interest at 1% per month until redemption.

<u>Present constitution</u> provides that in the city of New Orleans, abandoned or blighted property shall be redeemable for 18 months after the date of recordation of the tax sale.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> retains <u>present constitution</u> but adds a provision that in parishes other than Orleans, that vacant residential or commercial property which is blighted or abandoned as defined in <u>present law</u>, shall be redeemable for 18 months after recordation of the tax sale by payment as provided in <u>present constitution</u>.

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Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held Nov. 4, 2014.

Effective Jan. 1, 2015.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Ways and Means</u> to the <u>original</u> bill.

1. Changes the redemption period for property which is blighted, abandoned, uninhabitable, or hazardous to 18 months.

House Floor Amendments to the reengrossed bill.

- 1. Deletes changes relative to abandoned or blighted property in the city of New Orleans and excludes Orleans Parish from provisions of <u>proposed constitutional</u> amendment.
- 2. Adds a provision that in any parish other than Orleans, vacant residential or commercial property which is blighted or abandoned as defined in <u>present law</u> shall be redeemable for 18 months after recordation of the tax sale by payment as provided in <u>present constitution</u>.
