## DIGEST

Jones HB No. 128

<u>Present law</u> provides for financial security in certain cases, for surviving spouses and children of firemen, certain law enforcement, all correctional officers, or others who suffer death as a result of an injury arising out of and in the course of the performance of his official duties as a fireman or officer, or arising out of any activity while on or off duty, in his capacity as a fireman or officer, in the protection of life and property. Further provides for the definition of firemen and law enforcement officer.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> includes any regularly employed or volunteer fireman of any federally or state recognized Indian tribe or tribal unit within the definition of firemen. <u>Proposed law</u> includes any full-time tribal law enforcement officer employed by a federally or state recognized Indian tribe or tribal unit.
