Prohibits the release of information associated with concealed handgun permits or applications for such permits

<u>Present law</u> provides for the issuance of concealed handgun permits and provides that any information contained in an application or in connection with the application is confidential and not subject to any public records request. <u>Present law</u> provides that the Department of Public Safety shall not release any list of persons who applied for or received a permit for a concealed handgun. <u>Proposed law</u> prohibits the release of this information as contained in <u>present law</u> and provides for penalties for the release of information.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

<u>Proposed law</u> establishes potential imprisonment terms of not more than six months for certain categories of violations. Any offender sentenced to the custody of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections increases expenditures by \$24.39 per day per offender in local facilities. To the extent that offenders are sentenced and housed in state facilities, the cost per day per offender is \$47.74. Currently, the Department of Corrections houses 50% of state offenders at the local level and 50% at the state level.

For illustrative purposes, if 10 persons are convicted of this crime, with 5 offenders housed at the local level and 5 offenders at the state level, the annualized cost of incarceration would be 44,512 at the local level (5 offenders x 44.39 per day x 365 days) and 87,126 at the state level (5 offenders x 47.74 per day x 365 days) for a total cost of 131,638 (44,512 + 87,126).

REVENUE EXPLANATION

Courts in the state may realize periodic increased revenues to the degree that any Department of Public Safety employee, law enforcement officer or other individual violates the provisions of the proposed law and is required to pay a civil fine of up to \$10,000. The frequency of any such occurrences is speculative and the Legislative Fiscal Office is unable to estimate any regular, recurring revenues as a result of the proposed law.
