

Prior law required that any person who makes application to an insurer for a policy of insurance that will cover a motorcycle to provide proof of the appropriate motorcycle license endorsements at the time of the application.

Prior law prohibited an insurer from issuing a policy of motorcycle insurance to any person who did not provide proof of the license endorsement required by prior law.

Prior law also authorized an insurer to, in the event of an initial application for a policy of insurance to cover a motorcycle, allow the applicant 30 days to provide proof of the appropriate motorcycle license endorsements.

New law changes prior law by requiring that any person who makes application to an insurer for a policy of insurance that will cover a motorcycle to provide proof of the appropriate motorcycle license endorsements within 90 days of application submittal.

New law changes prior law by requiring an applicant making initial application for a policy of motorcycle insurance to submit proof of the appropriate motorcycle license endorsement to the insurer within 90 days of application submittal instead of 30 days.

New law deletes the provision of prior law prohibiting an insurer from issuing a policy of motorcycle insurance to any person who does not provide proof of the appropriate motorcycle license endorsements at the time of submittal.

Effective August 1, 2013.
