**Abstract:** Increases the possible term of imprisonment for the crime of aggravated flight from an officer to not more than 10 years.

<u>Present law</u> defines the crime of aggravated flight from an officer as the intentional refusal of a driver to bring a vehicle to a stop or of an operator to bring a watercraft to a stop, under circumstances wherein human life is endangered, knowing that he has been given a visual and audible signal to stop by a police officer when the officer has reasonable grounds to believe that the driver or operator has committed an offense.

<u>Present law</u> provides that any person who commits such offense may be fined not more than \$2,000 and shall be imprisoned for not more than two years.

<u>Proposed law</u> increases the possible term of imprisonment for the commission of aggravated flight from an officer <u>from</u> not more than two years to not more than 10 years.
