DIGEST

Amedee (SB 134)

<u>Present law</u> provides that the Board of Ethics use certified mail to send notices of delinquency.

<u>Proposed law</u> allows the Board of Ethics to use a private process server to send notices of delinquency.

<u>Present law</u> provides that notices of hearings and orders issued by the Ethics Adjudicatory Board are to be sent in writing.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that notices of hearings and orders issued by the Ethics Adjudicatory Board are to be sent via certified mail.

<u>Present law</u> provides no maximum fee for late filing of financial disclosure reports, (Tier 1).

<u>Proposed law</u> sets the maximum fee for late filing personal financial disclosure reports with a \$500 a day fee at \$12,500.
