## DIGEST

Morrish (SB 178)

<u>Proposed law</u> defines a health care sharing ministry as a faith based, nonprofit, tax-exempt organization that limits its participants to those who are of a similar faith and that acts as a facilitator between participants who have financial or medical needs and participants who have the ability to provide financial or medical assistance.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires financial contributions to be made without assumption of risk or the promise to pay by the participants or the ministry.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the ministry to provide written monthly statements to all participants listing the total dollar amount of qualified financial or medical needs submitted to the ministry as well as the dollar amount actually published or assigned to the participants for their contribution.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the ministry to provide a disclaimer on all applications and guideline materials published by or on behalf of the ministry that reads, in substance: "Notice: The ministry facilitating the sharing of medical expenses is not an insurance company. Neither the guidelines nor the plan of operation of the ministry constitutes an insurance policy. Financial assistance for the payment of medical expenses is strictly voluntary. Participation in the ministry or a subscription to any publication issued by the ministry shall not be considered as enrollment in a group health insurance plan or as a waiver of your responsibility to pay your medical expenses."

<u>Proposed law</u> exempts health care sharing ministries from all other provisions of the state insurance laws unless the law expressly includes the ministries or the law is made applicable to the ministries by <u>proposed law</u>.

Effective August 1, 2014.
