ANIMALS. Exempts certain persons from the requirements of the big exotic cats rules. (8/1/14)

AN ACT

| 8 | Section 1. R.S. 56:6(31) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: |

| 12 | (31) Shall promulgate rules and regulations to control the importation and |
| 13 | private possession of big exotic cats including but not limited to tigers, lions, |
| 14 | leopards, jaguars, cheetahs, and hybrids resulting from cross-breeding of such cats. |
| 15 | The rules shall provide exceptions for big cats traditionally kept by colleges and |
| 16 | universities as school mascots, animal sanctuaries, zoos, wildlife research centers, |

and scientific organizations, and any person licensed by the United States

1 Department of Agriculture as a class C exhibitor under the Animal Welfare Act. 2 Such rules shall address Internet purchase of such animals. Such rules shall also 3 provide for permits for certain institutions and for owners who can prove previous ownership. Previous owners shall include persons who obtained their animal by 4 lawful means prior to August 1, 2006. Violation of rules and regulations adopted 5 pursuant to the provisions of this Paragraph constitutes a class two violation 6 7 punishable as provided in R.S. 56:32. 8 9 Section 2. The provisions of this Act shall be given retroactive application.

DIGEST

Ward (SB 250)

<u>Present law</u> provides that the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission through its secretary may promulgate rules and regulations to control the importation and private possession of big exotic cats. Requires that the rules provide exceptions for big cats traditionally kept by colleges and universities, animal sanctuaries, zoos, wildlife research centers, and scientific organizations and for owners who can prove previous ownership.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds an additional exception for owners who hold a USDA class C exhibitor's license.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a previous owner will include persons who obtained their animal by lawful means prior to August 1, 2006.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for retroactive application.

Effective August 1, 2014.
