MARRIAGE: Provides relative to notice of certain expenses under the Covenant of Marriage Act

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 9:273(A)(1) and (2)(a), 273.1, 275(C)(1)(a) and (b)(i), and 3 275.1, relative to covenant marriages; to provide for notice of certain expenses; and 4 to provide for related matters. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 6 Section 1. R.S. 9:273(A)(1) and (2)(a), 273.1, 275(C)(1)(a) and (b)(i), and 275.1 are 7 hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 8 §273. Covenant marriage; contents of declaration of intent 9 A. A declaration of intent to contract a covenant marriage shall contain all 10 of the following: 11 (1) A recitation signed by both parties to the following effect: "A COVENANT MARRIAGE 12 13 We do solemnly declare that marriage is a covenant between a man and a 14 woman who agree to live together as husband and wife for so long as they both may 15 live. We have chosen each other carefully and disclosed to one another everything 16 which could adversely affect the decision to enter into this marriage. We have 17 received premarital counseling at our own expense on the nature, purposes, and 18 responsibilities of marriage. We have read the Covenant Marriage Act, and we 19 understand that a Covenant Marriage is for life. If we experience marital difficulties, 20 we commit ourselves to take all reasonable efforts to preserve our marriage,

including marital counseling <u>at our own expense</u>, <u>and understand that additional legal</u> <u>counseling may be required in order to obtain a divorce</u>.

With full knowledge of what this commitment means, we do hereby declare that our marriage will be bound by Louisiana law on Covenant Marriages and we promise to love, honor, and care for one another as husband and wife for the rest of our lives."

(2)(a) An affidavit by the parties attesting they have received premarital counseling from a priest, minister, rabbi, clerk of the Religious Society of Friends, any clergyman of any religious sect, or a professional marriage counselor, which counseling shall include a discussion of the seriousness of covenant marriage, communication of the fact that a covenant marriage is a commitment for life, a discussion of the obligation to seek marital counseling in times of marital difficulties, the necessity of payment for the required marital counseling and probable legal counseling, and that they have received and read the informational pamphlet developed and promulgated by the office of the attorney general entitled "Covenant Marriage Act" which provides a full explanation of the terms, expenses, and conditions of a covenant marriage.

### §273.1. Declaration of intent; form

A. The following is suggested as a form for the recitation which may be used by the couple:

# "DECLARATION OF INTENT

We do solemnly declare that marriage is a covenant between a man and a woman who agree to live together as husband and wife for so long as they both may live. We have chosen each other carefully and disclosed to one another everything which could adversely affect the decision to enter this marriage. We have received premarital counseling at our own expense on the nature, purposes, and responsibilities of marriage. We have read the Covenant Marriage Act, and we understand that a Covenant Marriage is for life. If we experience marital difficulties,

1 we commit ourselves to take all reasonable efforts to preserve our marriage, 2 including marital counseling at our own expense, and we further understand that 3 additional legal counseling may be required in order to obtain a divorce under the 4 Covenant Marriage Act. **Abstract:** Provides for required notification of expenses that will be incurred for required marital counseling and possible legal counseling in the process of obtaining a judgment of divorce or a judgment of separation of bed and board under the Covenant of Marriage Act.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the Covenant Marriage Act which establishes special procedures in order to enter into a covenant marriage and to obtain a divorce under a covenant marriage.

<u>Present law</u> provides for certain declarations and forms required to be used in a covenant marriage.

<u>Present law</u> requires premarital counseling in order to enter into a covenant marriage and requires marriage counseling to attempt to resolve marital conflicts prior to obtaining a divorce or a judgment of separation from bed and board.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further provides for required notice of expenses that will be incurred for required marital counseling and possible legal counseling in the process of obtaining a judgment of divorce or a judgment of separation of bed and board.
