# MTR VEHICLE/DRIVER LIC: Provides for the issuance of REAL ID compliant driver's licenses and special identification cards

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 32:410(D) and R.S. 40:1321(M) and to repeal Act No. 807 of the 2008
3	Regular Session of the Legislature and Act No. 151 of the 2010 Regular Session of
4	the Legislature, relative to the issuance of driver's licenses and special identification
5	cards in compliance with the REAL ID Act of 2005; to provide for implementation
6	of the REAL ID Act; to provide for exceptions; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 32:410(D) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§410. Form of license; photograph, signature of license, anatomical gift statement,
10	declaration of life-sustaining procedures, and additional information in
11	license
12	* * *
13	D.(1) The department shall provide for the issuance of driver's licenses in the
14	manner set forth in Paragraphs (2) through (4) of this Subsection upon the official
15	notification by the United States Department of Homeland Security that, on a date
16	certain, federal agencies will no longer accept the Louisiana issued driver's licenses
17	and special identification cards that are not compliant with the standards of the
18	REAL ID Act of 2005 and federal rules adopted pursuant thereto as of January 1,
19	2014, hereinafter collectively referred to as REAL ID, for official purposes.

1	(2) Any person applying for a driver's license pursuant to the provisions of
2	this Chapter may elect to apply for a driver's license that complies with the standards
3	of REAL ID. If that person is eligible for a driver's license to be issued pursuant to
4	the provisions of this Chapter and meets all requirements of the United States
5	Department of Homeland Security for a REAL ID compliant credential, that person
6	shall be issued a driver's license which bears a United States Department of
7	Homeland Security approved security marking reflecting that such credential meets
8	REAL ID standards.
9	(3) If a person applying for a driver's license pursuant to the provisions of
10	this Section does not elect to apply for a driver's license that complies with REAL
11	ID standards and that person is otherwise eligible to be issued a driver's license
12	pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter, that person shall be issued a driver's
13	license which indicates the driver's license is not in compliance with REAL ID. If
14	the person has elected not to apply for a REAL ID compliant driver's license, the
15	department shall not require the applicant to comply with any of the REAL ID
16	requirements, other than those required by this Paragraph, which were not required
17	by the state as of January 1, 2014.
18	(4) Except as provided in this Subsection, compliance with REAL ID
19	referenced in this Subsection shall be limited to those standards in effect as of
20	January 1, 2014. Any subsequent changes or additions to federal laws or rules for
21	implementation of REAL ID shall be implemented by the state if and only if such
22	changes are approved by the legislature by a favorable vote of a majority of the
23	elected members of each house.
24	Section 2. R.S. 40:1321(M) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
25	§1321. Special identification cards; issuance; veteran designation; "I'm a Cajun"
26	designation; fees; expiration and renewal; exceptions; promulgation of rules;
27	promotion of use; persons less than twenty-one years of age; the Protect and
28	Save our Children Program; Selective Service Registration

1	M.(1) The department shall provide for the issuance of special identification
2	cards in the manner set forth in Paragraphs (2) through (4) of this Subsection upon
3	official notification by the United States Department of Homeland Security that, on
4	a date certain, federal agencies will no longer accept the Louisiana issued driver's
5	licenses and special identification cards that are not compliant with the standards of
6	the REAL ID Act of 2005 and federal rules adopted pursuant thereto as of January
7	1, 2014, hereinafter collectively referred to as REAL ID, for official purposes.
8	(2) Any person applying for a special identification card pursuant to the
9	provisions of this Chapter may elect to apply for a special identification card that
10	complies with the standards of REAL ID. If that person is eligible for a special
11	identification card to be issued pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter and meets
12	all requirements of the United States Department of Homeland Security for a REAL
13	ID compliant credential, that person shall be issued a special identification card
14	which bears a United States Department of Homeland Security approved security
15	marking reflecting that such credential meets REAL ID standards.
16	(3) If a person applying for a special identification card pursuant to the
17	provisions of this Section does not elect to apply for a license that complies with
18	REAL ID standards and that person is otherwise eligible to be issued a special
19	identification card pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter, that person shall be
20	issued a special identification card which indicates the special identification card is
21	not in compliance with REAL ID. If the person has elected not to apply for a REAL
22	ID compliant special identification card, the department shall not require the
23	applicant to comply with any of the REAL ID requirements, other than those
24	required by this Paragraph, which were not required by the state as of January 1,
25	<u>2014.</u>
26	(4) Except as provided in this Subsection, compliance with REAL ID
27	referenced in this Subsection shall be limited to those standards in effect as of
28	January 1, 2014. Any subsequent changes or additions to federal laws or rules for
29	implementation of REAL ID shall be implemented by the state if and only if such

- 3 Section 3. Act No. 807 of the 2008 Regular Session of the Legislature and Act No.
- 4 151 of the 2010 Regular Session of the Legislature are hereby repealed in their entirety.
- 5 Section 4. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
- 6 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
- 7 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
- 8 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
- 9 effective on the day following such approval.

**Abstract:** Provides for the issuance of REAL ID compliant driver's licenses and special identification cards.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the issuance of driver's licenses and special identification cards in the manner set forth in <u>present law</u> upon the occurrence of official notification by the U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security that, on a date certain, federal agencies will no longer accept the La. issued driver's licenses and special identification cards that are not compliant with the standards of the REAL ID Act of 2005 and federal rules adopted pursuant thereto as of Jan. 1, 2014.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that any person applying for a driver's license or special identification card pursuant to the provisions of <u>present law</u> may elect to apply for a license that complies with the standards of REAL ID.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that if a person is eligible for a license or special identification card to be issued pursuant to the provisions of <u>present law</u> and meets all requirements of the U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security for a REAL ID compliant credential, that person must be issued a license or special identification card which bears a U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security approved security marking reflecting that such credential meets REAL ID standards.

<u>Proposed law</u> specifies that if a person applying for a driver's license or special identification card pursuant to the provisions of <u>present law</u> does not elect to apply for a license or special identification card that complies with REAL ID standards and that person is otherwise eligible to be issued a license or special identification card pursuant to the provisions of <u>present law</u>, that person shall be issued a license or special identification card which indicates the license or special identification card is not in compliance with REAL ID.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that if the person has elected not to apply for a REAL ID compliant license or special identification card, the department must not require the applicant to, relative to labeling of the license, comply with any of the REAL ID requirements, other than those required by <u>proposed law</u>, which were not required by the state as of Jan. 1, 2014.

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<u>Proposed law</u> provides, except as provided in <u>proposed law</u>, compliance with REAL ID referenced must be limited to those standards in effect as of Jan. 1, 2014. Provides that any subsequent changes or additions to federal laws or rules for implementation of REAL ID must be implemented by the state if and only if such changes are approved by the legislature by a favorable vote of a majority of the elected members of each house.

<u>Present law</u> (Act No. 807 of the 2008 R.S.) directs the Dept. of Public Safety ad Corrections, including the office of motor vehicles, not to implement the provisions of the REAL ID Act.

Proposed law repeals present law.

<u>Present law</u> (Act No. 151 of the 2010 R.S.) directs the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections, including the office of motor vehicles, not to implement the provisions of the PASS ID Act.

Proposed law repeals present law.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
