

1 WHEREAS, a lifelong resident of Baker, Mike was employed as a chemical plant
2 manager when his life of public service began with his election as a member of the Baker
3 City Council in 1972 and later with his election as the city's mayor in 1976; and

4 WHEREAS, at that time, Mike was the youngest elected city council member and
5 mayor in Louisiana and won a second mayoral term in 1980; and

6 WHEREAS, with each election he ran a grassroots campaign; he walked door-to-
7 door, shook hands, and asked constituents about improvements that would make their
8 community a better place in which to live; and

9 WHEREAS, his accomplishments were many, as councilman he voted to reduce the
10 city's utility service fee to a flat rate of one dollar per month for senior citizens and as mayor
11 he had ad valorem taxation rates reduced by thirty-three percent; and

12 WHEREAS, as mayor he was very energetic and brimming with new ideas; he
13 focused on efficiency in city government operations that included adoption of a digital
14 database format for utility services; and he was frugal with taxpayer monies and always had
15 an end-of-year surplus; and

16 WHEREAS, in 1981, after serving five years as mayor, he ran and was elected to the
17 Louisiana State Senate in a special election to fill a vacated seat and for fifteen years he
18 represented Senate District 13 that included portions of the parishes of East Feliciana, East
19 Baton Rouge, and Livingston; and

20 WHEREAS, during his distinguished tenure in the Louisiana Senate, Senator Cross
21 authored and coauthored various critical pieces of legislation concerning pro-life issues,
22 pro-labor and the prevailing wage, local and municipal finance, tighter regulation of anabolic
23 steroid usage, establishment of the Baker Independent School District, flood control and
24 drainage infrastructure projects, and the creation of the homeschool program that provided
25 parents with an educational alternative that allowed for a home-study curriculum; and

26 WHEREAS, during his exemplary service to the citizens of Louisiana, Senator Cross,
27 a conservative, was a loyal and viable member of the Democratic Party; however, he cared
28 little for partisan politics and more about what he could do for the betterment of the people
29 he served; and

30 WHEREAS, while in the Louisiana Senate he served as vice-chairman of the Finance

1 Committee and he also served on Senate committees on Judiciary B, Local and Municipal
2 Affairs, Retirement, Environmental Quality, and Labor and Industrial Relations; and

3 WHEREAS, after his tenure ended in the Louisiana Senate in 1996, Mike Cross was
4 appointed as vice president of the Louisiana Housing Corporation, then opened his own
5 lobbying firm, Cross and Co., which represented high level clients such as CLECO electric
6 utilities and the Louisiana Municipal Association; and

7 WHEREAS, Mike Cross enjoyed the company of others; he possessed a friendly
8 demeanor and a fun-loving spirit of adventure no matter what the activity; he loved music
9 and singing; also he frequently used an adage which he attributed to his father, that
10 "Everyday is a good day, some are just better than others."; and

11 WHEREAS, Mike Cross is survived by his wife, Kristie, four sons, Shane Michael,
12 Clifton Lance, Ryan Michael, and Matthew Aaron, two daughters, Lauren Adrienne and
13 Christen Joanna Cross, and two sisters, Pat Cross and Lori C. Martinez, plus a host of
14 precious friends and extended family; and

15 WHEREAS, Mike Cross shall be remembered by his many contemporaries in the
16 Louisiana Legislature for his ability to stand his ground on principle, his fearlessness, his
17 tireless work ethic, and his ability to speak directly from his heart; as a legislator, he was
18 tenacious, always focused on the task at hand, and always personable; and

19 WHEREAS, Mike Cross was a Christian with a generous heart who shared his
20 invaluable knowledge with others; he proved himself to be a man of many talents and of his
21 word, and a man whose dedication to this state and its people was without par; and

22 WHEREAS, he wore the mantle of community service proudly and willingly while
23 extending courtesy and friendship to all; and

24 WHEREAS, although the passing of Mike Cross has left a tremendous void in his
25 community, he leaves a rich and unique legacy that shall live on in the hearts of all who
26 knew him throughout the halls of this Legislature and the state of Louisiana.

27 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
28 express its sincere and heartfelt condolences upon the passing of Senator Mike Cross,
29 businessman, civic leader, and legislator, and does hereby acknowledge that his life was
30 well-spent in service to his country, his community, and his state.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to his
2 widow, Kristie Cross.
