For purposes of this Section, the following definitions shall apply: 11 (1) "Court officer" means any active or retired justice of the peace, any 12 active or retired judge of a city, parish, state, or federal court located in this state, any 13 district attorney, assistant district attorney, or investigator within the office of a 14 district attorney, any city prosecutor, assistant city prosecutor, or investigator within 15 the office of a city prosecutor, and the attorney general and any assistant attorney 16 general or investigator within the office of the attorney general, and any clerk of 17 court, recorder of mortgages, and their deputies. 18

Abstract: Expands the crime of filing a false lien against a law enforcement or court officer to include any clerk of court, recorder of mortgages, and their deputies.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the crime of filing a false lien against a law enforcement or court officer which occurs when a person files any public records, or any private record which is generally available to the public, any false lien or encumbrance against the real or personal property of a law enforcement officer or court officer, as retaliation against the officer for the performance of his official duties, knowing or having reason to know that such lien or encumbrance is false or contains any materially false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or representation.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands the definition of "court officer" to include any clerk of court, recorder of mortgages, and their deputies.
