Provides for surrogacy in Louisiana

<u>In present law</u>, a contract for surrogate motherhood is null, void and unenforceable. <u>Proposed law</u> repeals <u>present law</u>. <u>Proposed law</u> nullifies a genetic surrogacy contract. <u>Proposed law</u> provides for the enforceability of a gestational surrogacy contract that are deemed medically necessary by an OB/GYN physician. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that gestational surrogacy contracts may be court approved after record checks by the local sheriff or state police, the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS), and the Supreme Court. <u>Proposed law</u> provides, through a court order, that the intended parents shall be recognized as the legal parents before the birth of the child. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that all court proceedings are confidential. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that the DCFS may request a post-birth order from the court if the intended parents fail to do so. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that the court, through a post-birth order, direct the issuance of a new birth certificate and specifies the contents of the birth certificate. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that a party of the gestational surrogacy contract may annul a post-birth order on grounds of fraud or duress.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

This proposed legislation may result in an increase in State General Fund expenditures as a result of authorizing the enforceability of gestational surrogacy contracts; however the exact fiscal impact of this legislation on courts is indeterminable. Judicial workload and attendance (presence of judges, magistrates, clerks, bailiffs, counsel, etc.) costs associated with approval and enforceability of gestational surrogacy contracts are indeterminable because the number of surrogacy contracts that will be filed is unknown.

Also, the proposed legislation requires parties to a gestational surrogacy contract to obtain background checks from the local sheriff or Office of State Police and the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) as well as obtain a new birth certificate from the Department of Health and Hospitals (DHH). Any fees associated with obtaining backgrounds checks and new birth certificates will be the responsibility of the parties to the gestational surrogacy contracts. The Legislative Fiscal Office anticipates that any additional work associated with this legislation in the departments mentioned above will be incremental in nature, and that the departments can potentially accomplish these tasks utilizing existing staff.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
