EMPLOYMENT/WAGES-MINIMUM

OR NO IMPACT See Note

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(Constitutional Amendment) Provides with respect to the prohibition of the passage of a local or special law regarding labor.

The proposed constitutional amendment provides for the adoption of a joint resolution by the legislature to amend the constitution regarding local or special laws regulating labor; and the placement of a proposition on the official ballot for electors to vote whether they support an amendment to allow the legislature to enact a local law regarding minimum wages (effective 1/1/2015). The present constitution provides that the legislature shall not pass a local or special law regarding labor, trade, manufacturing or agriculture; fixing the rate of interest. The proposed constitutional amendment would allow the legislature to enact a local or special law regarding minimum wages. It further provides that the proposed amendment shall be submitted to the electors at the 11/4/2014 statewide election.
