Nevers (SB 240)

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that, in addition to the requirements regarding transmission of notice of judgment and copies of decisions under the Uniform Rules of La. Courts of Appeal, when a decision in an appellate court in a criminal appeal is rendered, the clerk of court is to transmit a notice or copy of the decision to the clerk of court from which the appeal was taken and to the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that when a decision of the supreme court is rendered in a criminal appeal, the clerk of court is to transmit a notice or copy of the decision to the clerk of court from which the appeal was taken and to the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections.
