CRIME/PUNISHMENT. Adds vehicular homicide to the list of crimes of violence. (gov sig)

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 14:2(B)(45) and 32.1(C), relative to crimes of violence; to add vehicular
3	homicide to the list of crimes of violence; to provide relative to penalties for
4	vehicular homicide; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 14:2(B)(45) and 32.1(C) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	§2. Definitions
8	* * *
9	B. In this Code, "crime of violence" means an offense that has, as an element,
10	the use, attempted use, or threatened use of physical force against the person or
11	property of another, and that, by its very nature, involves a substantial risk that
12	physical force against the person or property of another may be used in the course
13	of committing the offense or an offense that involves the possession or use of a
14	dangerous weapon. The following enumerated offenses and attempts to commit any
15	of them are included as "crimes of violence":

17	(45) Vehicular homicide, when the operator's blood alcohol

This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 11 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. DIGEST

Kostelka (SB 55)

<u>Present law</u> defines "crime of violence" and lists certain <u>present law</u> crimes that fall under this definition.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds vehicular homicide, when the operator's blood alcohol concentration exceeds 0.20 percent by weight based on grams of alcohol per 100 cubic centimeters of blood, to the list of crimes of violence.

<u>Present law</u> defines the crime of vehicular homicide and provides for penalties.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that whoever commits the crime of vehicular homicide is to be sentenced as an offender convicted of a crime of violence if the offender's blood alcohol concentration, at the time of the offense, exceeds 0.20 percent by weight based on grams of alcohol per 100 cubic centimeters of blood.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
