HOUSE BILL NO. 514

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES: Restricts the sale of dextromethorphan

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 40:962.1.2, relative to nonprescription products containing dextromethorphan;
3	to prohibit the selling, purchasing, or attempting to purchase products containing
4	dextromethorphan by minors; to provide for criminal penalties; to provide for
5	preemption of local ordinances regulating the same matters; and to provide for
6	related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 40:962.1.2 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§962.1.2. Restriction on the sale and purchase of nonprescription products
10	containing dextromethorphan, its salts or optical isomers, and salts of optical
11	<u>isomers</u>
12	A.(1) It shall be unlawful to sell a nonprescription material, compound,
13	mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of dextromethorphan, its
14	salts or optical isomers, or salts of optical isomers to any person under the age of
15	eighteen.
16	(2) It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of eighteen to purchase
17	or attempt to purchase a nonprescription material, compound, mixture, or preparation
18	containing any detectable quantity of dextromethorphan, its salts or optical isomers,
19	or salts of optical isomers.
20	B.(1) A nonprescription material, compound, mixture, or preparation
21	containing any detectable quantity of dextromethorphan, its salts or optical isomers,
22	or salts of optical isomers shall not be sold unless the purchaser submits a valid,
23	current form of photo identification issued by the state of Louisiana, another state or

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2	military identification card, state identification card, or passport.
3	(2) Each form of identification shall on its face establish the age of the
4	person as eighteen years or older, and there must be no reason to doubt the
5	authenticity or correctness of the identification. No form of identification shall be
6	accepted as proof of age if it is expired, defaced, mutilated, or altered. If the state
7	identification card or lawful identification submitted is a duplicate, the person shall
8	submit additional information which contains the name, date of birth, and
9	photograph of the person.
10	C. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to a compound, mixture, or
11	preparation containing any detectable quantity of dextromethorphan which is
12	dispensed pursuant to a valid prescription from a licensed practitioner with
13	prescriptive authority.
14	D.(1) A person who violates the provisions of this Section by selling a
15	nonprescription compound, mixture, or preparation containing any detectable
16	quantity of dextromethorphan, its salts or optical isomers, or salts of optical isomers
17	shall be fined not more than fifty dollars for the first violation. The penalties for
18	subsequent violations shall include a fine of not more than one hundred dollars for
19	the second violation, a fine of not more than one hundred fifty dollars for the third
20	and any subsequent violation.
21	(2) A person who violates the provisions of this Section by purchasing or
22	attempting to purchase a nonprescription compound, mixture, or preparation
23	containing any detectable quantity of dextromethorphan, its salts or optical isomers,
24	or salts of optical isomers shall be fined not more than fifty dollars for a first
25	violation and not more than two hundred dollars for a second or subsequent
26	violation.
27	E. The legislature hereby recognizes the need for uniformity in the sales of
28	nonprescription compounds, mixtures, or preparations containing any detectable
29	quantity of dextromethorphan, its salts or optical isomers, and salts of optical

isomers. Therefore, the provisions of this Section shall supersede and preempt any
rule, regulation, code, statute, or ordinance of any political subdivision or other unit
of local government that attempts to regulate the sale or purchase of nonprescription
compounds, mixtures, or preparations containing any detectable quantity of
dextromethorphan, its salts or optical isomers, and salts of optical isomers.

Henry HB No. 514

Abstract: Prohibits the sale and purchase of compounds containing dextromethorphan by minors.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits the sale, purchase, or attempt to purchase products containing dextromethorphan by minors.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides penalties for selling a product containing dextromethorphan as follows:

- (1) First offense a fine of not more than \$50.
- (2) Second offense a fine of not more than \$100.
- (3) Third offense and any subsequent offense a fine of not more than \$150.

Provides that whoever violates <u>proposed law</u> by purchasing or attempting to purchase nonprescription products containing dextromethorphan, its salts or optical isomers, or salts of optical isomers shall be fined not more than \$50 for a first violation and not more than \$200 for a second or subsequent violation.

Provides that <u>proposed law</u> preempts any local ordinances regulating the sales of products containing dextromethorphan.
