- 26 <u>among other things, ale, beer, stout, porter and the like and containing more than six</u>
- 27 percent alcohol by volume. Malt beverages are exclusive of all "liquors" whether
- 28 they be defined as intoxicating or spirituous liquors, which are produced by
- 29 <u>distillation.</u>"
